Extending a hand to others

The Maury Regional Health Care Foundation is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization that works to expand health care services and community outreach programs throughout southern Middle Tennessee, helping to bridge the gaps and make a difference in the lives we serve.

Thanks to the generous support of our donors, the Foundation has provided more than \$4 million in programs and services throughout the region since its formation in 2006.

Established funds

There are a variety of ways to support specific patient populations or causes when you make a donation to any of the Foundation's multiple established funds.

General Fund: Funds are used for areas of greatest need that may not be covered by another fund

Behavioral Health Fund: Provides support to address the behavioral health needs of Maury Regional Health patients as well as Maury Regional Health employees and their families

Community Health Fund: Provides resources to assist with the unmet health care needs of underserved or uninsured populations

Dr. Maura Lipp Palliative Care Fund: Assists the Maury Regional Palliative Care program in meeting the unique needs of those facing chronic illnesses

Friends & Family Fund: Provides meals to a patient's primary support member while in our care as well as assists in funding a food pantry that provides groceries for those in need upon discharge

Medication & Transportation Fund: Provides medication, medical supplies and gas cards for patients experiencing financial need

Service Area Fund: Assists with prescription costs, medical expenses and other needs in the service areas of cancer, cardiology, diabetes, neonatal intensive care, pediatrics and breast health

The Retreat Fund: Operates a hospitality home for cancer patients

William R. Walter Employee Assistance Fund: Assists Maury Regional Health employees who have experienced an unexpected crisis or who are pursuing continuing education

Dr. Eslick Daniel Youth Health Initiatives Fund: Provides educational materials and resources for projects improving the health of youth

Wayne Medical Center Fund: Assists patients and employees at Wayne Medical Center experiencing financial need and provides funding for community health care needs

Robert Otwell Cancer Center Endowment: The interest from this endowment supports the needs of the Maury Regional Cancer Center and its patients

Wellness & Aquatics Complex Healthy Living Endowment: The interest from this endowment supports the healthy living needs of the most vulnerable among us, including but not limited to, the youth, homebound and senior citizens

Funding Highlights

During the past fiscal year, the Maury Regional Health Care Foundation funded more than \$387,700 in programs and services. From providing medications for seniors with limited incomes to feeding the hungry, the generosity of our donors has enabled us to impact the lives of others.



Delivering serenity

In October 2021, the Foundation unveiled a new serenity wall on the Labor & Delivery floor at Maury Regional Medical Center. The new wall greets family members with a scenic digital display of nature — equipped with falling leaves and rippling water — as they enter the waiting area for Labor & Delivery. The intention behind the wall is to provide peace and comfort to those awaiting news about their loved ones.

The new serenity wall was modeled after a similar concept on the medical center’s Critical Care Unit. It was made possible by a donation from Columbia resident Ronnie Erwin in memory of his late wife Lynn McKee Erwin, who volunteered as a candy striper at the hospital when she was a teenager before pursuing a lifelong career as an elementary school teacher.

Supporting local first responders

Earlier this year, the Foundation partnered with Columbia Breakfast Rotary to purchase new Autopulse automated CPR machines for Columbia Fire & Rescue. The technology provides high-quality automated CPR for victims of sudden cardiac arrest, helping to reduce interruptions in chest compressions during transport.

Hitting it out of the park

The Maury Regional Health Care Foundation provided a \$100,000 grant from its Wellness & Aquatics Complex Healthy Living Endowment to support the Miracle League of Columbia initiative at Maury County Park.

The Miracle League project is an all-inclusive ballpark and playground designed to meet the needs of disabled children and their families. The completed park will include cushioned rubber surfaces to help prevent injuries, a completely flat baseball field and wheelchair-accessible facilities.



Did you know?

Maury Regional Health’s mobile medical unit hit the road in 2018, providing health care services and support to underserved individuals throughout the region.

The mobile medical unit — which is easy to spot in the community with its bright colors and epic size — offers general and routine health screenings, such as checking blood pressure and body mass index, in addition to administering flu and COVID vaccines and providing education, outreach and preventative services. Since the unit began operation in 2018, it has touched the lives of more than 20,000 people.

The Foundation is proud to provide financial support for the unit, allowing its team to deliver compassionate care to the community members it serves.



Foundation names palliative care fund in honor of Dr. Maura Lipp



It is impossible to put a number to all the lives Maura Lipp, MD, has impacted throughout her life and career. Thanks to a fund now named in her honor, Dr. Lipp’s personal mission of providing compassion and dignity to all — sometimes in extraordinarily difficult moments — will continue to impact lives for countless years to come.

On March 9, the Maury Regional Health Care Foundation recognized Dr. Lipp for her contributions to expanding palliative care services in the region by naming a fund in her honor: the Dr. Maura Lipp Palliative Care Fund.

Throughout her career as a critical care specialist at Maury Regional Medical Center (MRMC), Dr. Lipp demonstrated a passion for supporting patients battling chronic disease. For some of these patients, their journeys involved palliative care, which focuses on improving the quality of life for patients with serious and end-of-life illnesses by assisting with pain relief, symptom control and stress relief as well as connecting patients and family members with beneficial resources.

“We are indebted to Dr. Lipp for introducing the concept of palliative care to Maury Regional Health and the communities we serve,” said Interim CEO and Chief Medical Officer Martin Chaney, MD. “In my medical training, most of the focus was on fighting diseases and prolonging life. Thanks to Dr. Lipp and our palliative care team, we are reminded as

clinicians that dignity and quality of life are also imperative and, at times, become the most important goals.”

Dr. Lipp joined the medical staff in 2008 and is board certified in internal medicine, pulmonary disease, critical care medicine and hospice and palliative care medicine. Dr. Lipp also previously served as medical director for Compassus, which provides outpatient palliative care services.

Working in critical care and having obtained palliative care certification, Dr. Lipp knew that patients needed the tools to better understand and manage chronic disease.

“It became clear to me very early on in my career that treating a patient with serious illness goes far beyond only the need to cure,” Dr. Lipp said. “Caring for our patients means focusing on quality of life as defined by that individual. To do so, we must address the total impact that illness brings — physically, emotionally, financially and spiritually. The best tool we have in our arsenal to accomplish this is palliative care.”

In 2012, Dr. Lipp began the process of establishing a palliative care program at MRMC. Her goal was to ensure that a program was in place to identify hospitalized individuals who could benefit from palliative care services and to begin providing them with the education and resources they would need prior to being discharged. After charting the path for a formalized program at the medical center and securing grant funding, the MRMC Palliative Care Program launched in 2014.

The program currently averages 350 consults per month and has touched nearly 12,000 lives since 2014. The team assists patients as they navigate from inpatient to outpatient care to fulfill their future needs.

“Dr. Lipp has made outstanding contributions to advancing the awareness and practice of palliative care,” Maury Regional Health Care Foundation Executive Director Joe Kilgore said. “This fund will ensure that her work, and the work of others, will continue to benefit patients and their families for generations.”

Contributions to the Dr. Maura Lipp Palliative Care Fund are used to assist in meeting the unique needs of those facing chronic illness. The fund was originally established in 2014, and the Maury Regional Health Care Foundation provided funding to assist in establishing the palliative care program and provide training for staff members.
